Legal philosophers tend to emphasize formal elements of the Rule of Law such as rule by general norms rather than particular decrees ; rule by norms laid down in advance rather than by retrospective enactments ; rule by

norms that are made public not hidden away in the closets of the administration ; and rule by clear and determinate legal norms norms whose meaning is not so vague or contestable as to leave those who are subject to them at the mercy of official discretion. My action can hardly be regarded as subject to the will of another person if I use his rules for my own purposes as I might use my knowledge of a law of nature, and if that person does not know of my existence or of the particular circumstances in which the rules will apply to me or of the effects they will have on my plans.
